ORDER REGARDING CONDUCT OF DEPOSITIONS

On this *22nd* day of *June*, 2009, it is hereby ordered and decreed that, absent good cause shown, the following Order shall govern all depositions conducted by either party in the In Re: Avandia litigation. The parties shall work together in good faith to schedule depositions on a date and time mutually convenient for both parties.

The depositions of plaintiff and spouse shall be conducted in Philadelphia on the same day, whenever practicable. The plaintiff's deposition shall not exceed six (6) hours of examination, inclusive of breaks but exclusive of meals, and depositions of any derivative claimant, including spouse, shall not exceed two (2) hours of examination.

The depositions of plaintiff's treating physicians, including the prescribing physician, will not exceed six (6) hours in duration. The depositions of any other fact witness, excluding physicians, shall not exceed (2) hours in duration.


